A message from the Headteacher, Mrs Smith:

Dear Parents.

I hope you have all had a lovely half term and feel rested ready for the remainder of the spring term. We have a busy and exciting five weeks with lots of events for the pupils.

This half term, we also have a very exciting competition for the pupils to take part in that links with our approach to spirituality. This language of spirituality begins from a Christian understanding that everyone is a valued creation, individually and uniquely made by God, like pots made by a potter (Isaiah 64:8). Yet, in life, things happen that impact on the physical 'pot' of life and create cracks that provide a glimpse of something 'beyond' the tangible. Christians would view this as an opportunity to relate to the Divine Creator God.

Cracks may be caused when something so good and breath-taking happens that the pot expands and cracks - the wows of life. Cracks may happen when something challenging happens and threatens the comfort of everyday - the ows of life. Cracks can also happen in the stillness and ordinariness of everyday - the nows of life, when a moment of stillness, a pause or prayer creates a crack in the normal, physical every day.

Wincle uses this language and the concepts of wows, ows and nows. These are used to explore relationships with ourselves, others, the wider natural world and beyond, and offering the invitation to relate to God.

To help cement our approach, we would like to create an image to represent an ow moment, a wow moment and a now moment and we would like the children to design these images. These images will be used to support our work in school, on our Facebook page and on our website. We will be launching this competition in worship this week, but support from home would be greatly appreciated. Please take your time as a family to discuss these moments and help your child think of images that could be used. All entries are to be returned to school by Friday 15th March. The winning images will be announced in worship on Friday 22nd March.

General Information

School Behaviour System

We follow a card system in school to ensure the children shine like a star in all that they do and do not stop other children also shining. We have three cards which give a clear, consistent approach so children know exactly what is expected and what is going to happen across the school.

Very often, saying a child's name, making a stop sign with our hand or raising an eyebrow is enough to make a child realise that they need to change something, but if their choices don't change, we don't assume they're 'naughty', we assume that we need to explain our expectations more clearly. The yellow card helps us to do this. A yellow card shouldn't be a serious situation. Yellow is any situation where a child needs to be reminded of the expectation. Using yellow at the right time prevents the behaviour progressing and prevents red from being a sudden shock.

Orange - to give a warning.

Red- a consequence, for example, the child might miss playtime so we can talk about what help they need.

Parents will be informed if their child has received an orange or red card through their home/school diary.

Money owed from the autumn term
