#### **General Information**

#### Attendance Update

Please find below our recent attendance figures which includes attendance up to and including Friday 1<sup>st</sup> March. Attendance is high on the agenda for the school's governing body and it is regularly discussed and analysed at each governor meeting.

Good attendance is having an attendance of 96% or above. Pupils will make good progress with attendance at this level.

Attendance between 90% and 96% requires improvement and it is highly likely that pupils' attainment and progress will be affected.

If a pupil has an attendance of lower than 90%, they are classed as a persistent absentee and will have gaps in their learning from lessons missed. These children are identified by the local authority and discussed at attendance reviews with the school, each term.

Parents will receive their child's individual attendance in their end of term data letter.

#### Wraparound Care

We are running All Stars on a Friday evening this half term as a trial to see if it will be financially viable to run moving forwards. Miss Kershaw will be running the session and normal costings apply.

Our first week was very busy but no one required the session last week. If you feel that this will be a benefit for the school, please do support the trial to ensure that it can continue.

#### Bad weather

Due to our remote location, we can sometimes struggle to get to school in bad weather, particularly snow. In the last two instances, where there has been a significant snowfall, it has started to fall at an inconvenient time.: drop off time. This has made bringing your children to school very stressful!

To make the decision whether to open or close the school, Mrs Smith liaises with the chair of governors, speaks to local residents and also looks at the weather forecast. A decision is also made based on whether all ways to Wincle School are blocked. Barlow Hill can be notoriously dangerous and so it is advised that coming to Wincle via Swythamley, or continuing on the A54 and turning right further down, may be safer.

Parents are aware of their own car's capabilities in bad weather and we all feel differently about driving in the snow or not. As the school is situated in the valley and usually, all staff are already in school, it is difficult for school staff to advise individual parents on whether to travel as they are unaware of road conditions higher up. This decision must be made by each parent. Sometimes, it may be best to wait a while and to show understanding, we are not formally recording lates on snow days.

#### Play therapist

Wincle School does have access to a Play Therapist from 'Turn the Page' counselling. To warrant a visit from the therapist, we require at least two pupils to book sessions. We have one family interested in using this service and are looking for at least one other family to book sessions. If you would like to find out more, please see Mrs Smith or contact the school office.

Why choose play therapy?

Play is a fun, enjoyable activity that elevates our spirits and brightens our outlook on life. It expands selfexpression, self-knowledge, self-actualization and self-efficacy. Play relieves feelings of stress and boredom, connects us to people in a positive way, stimulates creative thinking and exploration, regulates our emotions, and boosts our ego (Landreth, 2002). In addition, play allows us to practice skills and roles needed for survival. Learning and development are best fostered through play (Russ, 2004).

#### Wincle Fete

This year, the Wincle Fete will take place on Saturday 8<sup>th</sup> June and all of the pupils from Reception to Y6 will be involved with the opening ceremony.

The fete committee would like the school to organise and run the children's games, and so we are looking for parent helpers for the following times:

Over the last two years, the school has greatly benefitted from the Wincle Fete, receiving over £10,000 in funds. This money has been used in a variety of ways, for example, to take the whole school to the pantomime in December 2022, it has paid for the Lego Day recently held in school for Saturn and Mars as well as being used to pay for the transport to the forthcoming Winmarleigh residential.
